The Lord Mayor's Energy to Transform Lives

I am honoured to be promoting the City of London this year as the 686th The Lord Mayor Lord Mayor (and only the second woman since 1189). I have been overwhelmed by the support I have received from the Livery Companies and look forward to working with you this year. I am particularly grateful to the Feltmakers for my Tricorn hat, which I wear with pride.

The Reference to Energy

The theme of my mayoralty will be "The Energy to Transform Lives", which reflects my long association with the City as an energy lawyer specialising in global electricity industry reforms at CMS Cameron McKenna to bring cheaper and cleaner energy to more people. The title refers to my conviction that the City of London has the energy and talent for innovation necessary to serve the needs of society and the environment. All of my mayoral programmes are based on three themes which I feel are critical to our resource-constrained society: sustainability, diversity and charity. The four programmes are:

The Lord Mayor's Appeal 2014: We have abolished the "shut down and start up from scratch approach" to the Lord Mayor's Appeal by the creation of a permanent charity to provide a long-running platform for the Appeal. This year the Appeal is supporting four community-based charities that all have "the energy to transform lives": Beating Bowel Cancer; Princess Alice Hospice; Raleigh International; and Working Chance. Fundraising is at the heart of the Appeal programme but there is also a strong commitment to mentoring, helping to raise the profiles of these charities and opening up new sources of funding for the future.

Charity Leadership and Social Investment: Led by my husband Nicholas, this programme will shine a light on charity chairmen and how they can be better supported in their own development and in recruiting and leading effective boards.

The Power of Diversity: This programme of five breakfast seminars and two conferences will highlight and discuss the critical steps that businesses must take to maximise the energy that diversity can bring to business. All Day proceeds from the programme will go to The Lord Mayor's Appeal 2014.

Tomorrow's City: A programme of events and dialogue which focuses on how the City can best ensure its future success by enabling long-term value visit creation for an increasing urban population that is conscious of society and the environment more than ever before.

Spring Dinner


APOTHECARIES' HALL - MONDAY 7th APRIL 2014

The Worshipful Society of Apothecaries of London

The Apothecaries Society was incorporated as a City Livery Company in 1617. Its Hall (dating from 1668-72), archives and artefacts also record and reflect its activities as a major centre for manufacturing and retailing drugs (1671-1922), founder of Chelsea Physic Garden in 1673 and medical examining and licensing body from 1815. Tucked away beside the Thames, Chelsea Physic Garden is a celebration of the beauty and importance of plants. This walled Garden was founded in 1673 by the Worshipful Society of Apothecaries for its apprentices to study the medicinal qualities of plants. Livery Schools Link

Livery Schools Link was formed in 2003 from the former Adoption of Schools Working Party formed under the Lord Mayoralty of Sir Francis McWilliams in 1992/3 to help promote the traditional involvement of the Livery Companies in education and training.

It now has a wider role including providing support for the Lord Mayor's Financial Literacy Initiative. it advises the Livery on the forms help may take, which can range from full financial sponsorship of a new Academy to individuals offering a few hours of time on an ad-hoc basis. It acts as a focal point through which the educational community may make contact with the Livery. It acts as a forum for discussion and the exchange of ideas. It runs events for the Livery and for schools to develop the levels of interaction between them and encourage both sides to explore further what can be achieved. Inter-Livery Swimathon
